October 2019 *Barossa shiraz served soft, ripe and well made. You get what you come for. Blackberried fruit flavour, coffee-cream oak, whispers of earth and a sound, satisfying finish. It's dark and bold but not gloopy or over-done. Reliable as ever.*

November 2022 *It's sweetly fruited and inviting on the nose showing dark plum, blackberry, vanillin oak and toasted spice aromas, followed by a succulent palate that's superbly weighted and intensely flavoured. The wine is supple and fleshy with a lengthy silky finish. At its best: now to 2027.*

### Halliday Wine Companion 2021

November 2022 *It has all the definition and flavours of its region starting with a medley of spiced dark fruit, choc-mint, smoky, earthy and satisfying. Full-bodied with tannins somewhat stern and just clipping the finish.*

## 89-91 POINTS

June 2019 *Pastry crust and vanilla notes accent the baked boysenberries on the nose of the 2017 Shiraz. It's medium to full-bodied, lush and creamy on the palate, with soft, dusty tannins on the finish. It should be a fine value when it's bottled at the end of May. It's a blend of three estate vineyards, aged in large-format (500-liter) American oak, about 10% to 15% new.*
