Woody aromas of cinnamon and the bitter sweet fragrance of cloves mingle. Intense. ...we strongly recommend it although not necessarily in a G & T. Try it instead with Bitter Lemon, or with Fever Tree Ginger Ale and a squeeze of lemon.
