There's a lite toasty, creamy, rounded texture from lees and oak. On the palate -tense, creamy through satin textures, plenty of acidity then flavours of citrus pith and peach, lemon and fresh lychee, apple and blossoms. Many flavours make this wine with a moreish core of fruit, wood spice and waxy citrus fruits finish.

Brilliantly bright, straw-yellow with a lime hue, even colour throughout. The nose is inviting, well-packed aromas of chamomile, orange blossom and gunflint, melded with zesty citrus fruit, honey nuanced and a dusting of spices. Mediumbodied, flavours of an amalgam of citrus zest, interweave honey, jasmine tea, along with fragrant floral notes, lingers with gunflint details. The wine has lovely intensity and concentration, providing both weight and breath to the palate. The mouthfeel is unctuous and textural, flows smoothly with positive energy and drive, supported by lacy acidity, lingers to a long, sustained finish. This is a textural white blend with intense flavour concentration, a complex range of interest on a positive flow with flinty details.

The non-vintage wine on sale in late 2020 is based on Sémillon from the 2018 vintage, matured in large old barrels for 18 months, then blended with Muscat, Riesling, Sauvignon Blanc, Gewürztraminer and Chardonnay. Estate grown at Waipara, in North Canterbury, it is a bright, light yellow/green, concentrated, vigorous wine, poised and youthful, with strong, ripe, peachy, spicy flavours, showing excellent complexity.
